- Founded in 1960 to save the Old Corner Bookstore Building (1718), slated to be demolished for a parking garage.
- Oldest private commercial building
- 19th century offices of influential publisher Ticknor and Fields
- Renowned literary hub for American Renaissance writers Emerson, Thoreau, Alcott and others
- HBI continues to own and manage the building; net revenue supports HBI's preservation mission in Boston's neighborhoods.

Historic Boston Inc. (HBI)







- In 1979, HBI re-cast itself as a city-wide historic preservation revolving fund.
- Targets at-risk historic places in the municipality of Boston only.
- Old Corner Bookstore rental income subsidizes HBI programs and projects.
- Bookstore property is also leveraged at times to complete high risk preservation projects in Boston's neighborhoods.
